



From the South (MA/NH)

Take the Maine Turnpike (I-95) to Auburn, Exit 75 (formerly 12) - Follow Route 4 North through Farmington - Get on Route 27 North through Kingfield, straight to Sugarloaf.

or

Take I-95 North to Augusta, Exit 112B (formerly 31B) - Follow Route 27 North through Farmington and Kingfield, straight to Sugarloaf.

From the West-Montreal

Head east to Sherbrooke to the end of Route 10. Take 112 east to Route 253 south to Cookshire. Take a left onto Route 108 to Route 212 east through La Patrie to Woburn. Take Route 161 south to the U.S. border. Sugarloaf is approximately 58 kilometers south on Route 27.

Vermont/Western Massachusetts

Head north on I-91. Take Route U.S. 302 east to I-93 south (for four miles) to Route U.S. 302 east again. Turn north onto Route U.S. 3. At Route 115 junction head east to Route U.S. 2 east. At Route 4 head north to Route 27. Continue north on Route 27 to Sugarloaf.

From the East-Calais and Maritimes, Bangor

From Calais take Route 9 west to I-395 west to Bangor, to exit 1A onto I-95 south to Exit 39 at Newport, then Route 2 west to Skowhegan. Get on Route 201 north to Route 148 west through Madison, to Route 201A north to North Anson. Take a left onto Route 16 west to Kingfield, then Route 27 north to Sugarloaf.

Other Modes of Travel

Flights and bus service are available to Portland, Boston and Bangor. Trains are available to Boston and Portland. Transfer service and rental cars are available at airports and stations.

Tips to make your trip easier:

Coming North:

Tolls: 95 North in Hampton, NH (\$1.00), York, ME (\$1.50), Portland (\$.50), Augusta (\$.50)

Gas: There are gas stations along I-95 at many of the rest areas. From I-95, at exit 112B there is an Irving that is open 24 hours. The last gas station before Kingfield is in Farmington. There is a Cumberland Farms and Irving that are both open 24 hours. From Auburn there are a number of gas stations in Auburn and then the last stop before Kingfield is in Farmington.

Food: On I-95 there are a number of chain restaurants along the way in Portsmouth, NH, the rest stop in Kennebunkport, and Portland. In Auburn there are two 24-hour Denny's and a few Gas Stations with food served 24 hours. There are also a number of restaurants that stop serving food around 9:00pm. In Farmington, ME there are a number of fast food chains that are off of Rt. 2 including McDonalds, KFC, Burger King, etc. There is also the Granary which is located downtown.

Groceries: There is a Wal-Mart and a Hannaford's on Rt 2 in Farmington. On mountain there is also a small grocery store.

Groceries:

Coming West:

Gas: There is gas available in Skowhegan, Madison, and North Anson. There is also a gas station in Kingfield, and one at the bottom of the access road to Sugarloaf.

Food: Plenty of options abound in both Skowhegan and Madison. Looking for fast food? You will have to look no further there is a Burger King, McDonald's, and Wendy's all located in Madison. There are also restaurants if going to the drive-thru is not suitable to your taste buds.

Groceries: In Skowhegan there is a Hannaford's as well as a Shop n' Save. In Madison there is a Hannaford's. Mountain Side Grocers located at the bottom of the access road is open until 10p during the ski season.

Coming East:
